Contoocook Valley Radio Club Request for Ham Repeater on Communications Tower: Chiefs Morse, Aucoin, French has no objection to the Ham repeater request. Capital Area compact would like the repeater at least 20 feet below their equipment. Next steps: draft agreement with CVRC for hosting repeater, access, indemnification, and cost share.

Recycling: Thank you for your continued efforts to recycle the best you can! You do make a difference. Please continue to bring all your cardboard, mixed paper and #1 & #2 plastic bottles and jugs only. Please remember every ounce of recyclable glass that goes into the hopper is transported and disposed of by your tax dollars and ends up forever in a landfill or incinerator. Glass that is recycled save taxpayers' money in reduced hauling and disposal costs. So, next time you finish that bottle of wine, remember that recycling it contributes to a cleaner environment, conserves valuable resources, and saves you money on your tax bill. Other reasons to recycle glass from Microsoft Copilot:

1. Good for the Environment:

- O A glass bottle discarded in a landfill can take up to a million years to decompose. In contrast, a recycled glass bottle can reappear on store shelves as a new container in as little as 30 days.
- o Glass recycling is sustainable because glass containers are 100% recyclable. They can be recycled repeatedly without any loss of purity or quality. Recovered glass from recycling serves as the primary ingredient in all new glass containers. Approximately 70% of a typical glass container consists of recycled glass.

2. Conserves Natural Resources:

- o Every ton of recycled glass saves more than a ton of raw materials needed for new glass production. This includes 1,300 pounds of sand, 410 pounds of soda ash, and 380 pounds of limestone.
- By recycling glass, we reduce the demand for extracting these natural resources.

3. Energy Savings:

- o Creating new glass involves heating sand and other substances to a scorching 2,600 degrees Fahrenheit, consuming significant energy and emitting industrial pollution.
- Recycled glass, known as cullet, melts at a much lower temperature. Making glass products from cullet requires 40% less energy compared to using raw materials.

4. Useful and Safe:

- o Glass containers have minimal chemical interaction with their contents due to their stable materials (sand and limestone). Thus, glass can be safely reused, such as in refillable water bottles.
- o Recycled glass finds various commercial applications, from decorative tiles to rebuilding eroded beaches.

5. Simple and Rewarding:

- o Glass is one of the easiest materials to recycle. Most curbside recycling programs and municipal centers accept glass.
- o In some areas, you can even receive cash refunds for recycling glass bottles 1,2, 3.
