Amend Article IV General Provisions, by adding a new Section 133-21, Solar Energy Systems In addition, amend Article VRV VIIIage Proper District, Article VI RN Residential Neighborhood District, Article VII RR Rural Residential, Article VIII Commercial Districts by allowing by right roof mounted Solar Energy Systems and allow by Conditional Use Permit (CUP) ground mounted Solar Energy Systems. The renewable energy systems ordinance is enacted under the provisions of RSA 674:21,II Innovative Land Use Controls and in accordance with RSA 674:17.(I)(j), and the purposes outlined in RSA 672:1-III-a as amended The purpose of this ordinance is to accommodate Solar Energy Systems and Distributed Generation Resources in appropriate locations, while protecting the public's health, safety and welfare Placing systems in locations that result in loss of prime agricultural lands is strongly discouraged. It is preferable to locate systems on disturbed land, nonproductive farmland and/or rooftops. Goals will include: Allow for the use of Solar Energy Systems in the community while maintaining Henniker's scenic vistas, Preserve the community's rural character, particularly as seen from public roads; Minimize potential adverse impacts of Solar Energy Systems in the community by ensuring that such facilities are properly screened and are properly sited within existing topographic features of the property and Ensure consistent maintenance and safety procedures are in place to protect public health.

Explanation: With the rapid growth of ground mounted solar panel installations in Henniker, the Planning Board believes it is now appropriate to have some form of oversight on this new land use to protect the visual environment when these uses are installed.
